Questions to consider:

- 1. Are there any occupations or professions that many of your family members have chosen to pursue?
- 2. Do many of the occupations or professions that your family has chosen fall into similar sectors? I.e. Art, Culture, and Entertainment, Skilled Trades, Business and Flnance?
- 3. Are there any members of your family who have broken a cycle of similar occupations or professions?
- 4. How have your family career choices changed over time?
